

A guide for professionals

Turn the Page is a suite of services that helps children and young people who have displayed harmful sexual behaviour by supporting them, their families and their professional network.

Enquiries

If you're working with a child or young person and you're worried about their sexual behaviour, please contact our duty worker to discuss this with us. This is on a no names basis.

Consultations

One of the outcomes of your enquiry may be that we advise you to complete a referral form for a consultation. To do this, we will require parental consent. And depending on the age of the child or young person, their consent too.

A consultation aims to help our partners access advice. This ensures we can support professionals who are dealing with complex cases involving harmful sexual behaviour.

Assessments

If after speaking with us we recommend an assessment, we will ask you to complete a referral form.

We can provide AIM 3 assessments for:

- Children under the age of 12
- Adolescents
- Instances where technology assisted sexual behaviour has occurred

An AIM 3 assessment holistically assesses the child's or young person's harmful sexual behaviour.

We assess their sexual and non-sexual behaviour, their development, their family, their environment and their self-regulation.

The assessment helps us create an intervention plan, tailored to the child or young person and their family. We can then support them to reduce the risk of any harmful behaviour reoccurring.

Intervention

We have a range of interventions to make sure each child or young person we work with receives the right support.

The aim of the intervention is to help children and young people to:

- Develop strategies that prevent them from sexually harming others.
- Go on to have healthy sexual relationships in the future.
- Learn positive coping strategies.
- Improve their self-esteem and build on their strengths.

We also have a specific intervention for parents and carers which allows them to:

- Process their feelings.
- Understand harmful sexual behaviour.
- Understand how to support their child to move forward safely.



Our criteria

- 'Turn the Page' is for children and young people between the ages of 4 to 17 years.
- Consent is required from the parent and child or young person, except in the instance of an enquiry.
- A social worker must be allocated throughout an AIM 3 assessment. This will be reviewed regularly during intervention work.
- The referral for assessment or intervention must evidence that the child or young person's harmful sexual behaviour is high (amber or red) on the Brook Traffic Light tool.
- We cannot accept referrals for assessment or intervention until the police investigation and any court proceedings have been concluded. But we can offer a consultation at this stage.
- If you are referring for intervention only, it must be accompanied by a recent AIM 3 assessment.
- The child or young person must be in a stable placement and have parent or carer who will support them through the process.
